1. What events and choices led to the situation described in Exodus 11?
2. In what ways does God demonstrate His sovereignty in Exodus 11?
3. What does the blood of the lamb symbolize in the Passover in Exodus 12?
4. What was required of the Israelites in Exodus 12 if their firstborn sons were to be spared?
5. What significance does the unleavened bread and bitter herbs hold?
6. How does the Passover lamb relate to Christ in the New Testament?
7. What should we remember as we partake of communion today?

8. In Psalm 18.2, David refers to the Lord as his rock. What did he mean?
  
9. How does that picture impact your life? Do you recall a time when you felt God's presence and deliverance in a challenging situation?
  
10. What is the overall message of Proverbs 6:1-5? Did it change your thoughts about co-signing?
  
11. In Matthew 20.17-19, Jesus predicts His death for the third time. Why is it important for Jesus to repeatedly foretell His death and resurrection?
  
12. How did the disciples respond in verses 20-24? What does it say about their characters at that time?
  
13. What request do James and John make in verses 20-21, and how does Jesus respond?
  
14. What does Jesus teach about leadership and greatness in His kingdom through His response?
  
15. How does this passage impact your ideas about leadership?
