1.	How did the Israelites react to the lack of water at Rephidim in Exodus 17? What does their reaction reveal about their faith and trust in God?
2.	What lessons can we learn from Moses' actions in holding up the staff during the battle with the Amalekites in Exodus 17? What part did Aaron and Hur play?
3.	What does the victory over the Amalekites teach us about relying on God's strength rather than our own?
4.	How did Jethro, Moses father-in-law, respond to the accounts of God's faithfulness to the Israelites in Exodus 18?
5.	Describe the leadership structure that Jethro advised Moses to implement. How does this reflect principles of effective leadership? How might you implement more of these principles in your life?

6.	In Psalm 18.28, David said that the Lord lighted his darkness. How have you seen the Lord bring light to your darkness?
7.	How does Psalm 18.28-36 reflect the David's confidence in God's ability to help him overcome challenges?
8.	How does the imagery of God as a shield and a rock in Psalm 18.30-31 help you understand God's protective and steadfast nature?
9.	Consider the blessings and victories in your life. Take time to express gratitude and praise to God for His faithfulness in your life.
10.	As you reflect on each of the seven things God hates listed in Proverbs 6.16-19, could there be any area where you may need to examine your thoughts, words, or actions?
11.	What does the wedding feast represent in Matthew 22.1-14?
12.	What does the man without a wedding garment symbolize in those verses, and why is he cast into the outer darkness?
