1. What is the significance of the portions that are reserved for the priests from the offerings in Leviticus 7?
2. Why was such an elaborate consecration ceremony necessary for the priests in Leviticus 8?
3. Who is being referred to as "the King of Glory" in Psalm 24.7-10? What do these verses relate to?
4. What does Proverbs 9.10 tell us is the beginning of wisdom? What does that mean?
5. What does this passage (verses 10-12) teach us about our responsibility to accept or reject truth?
6. In Mark 1, Mark begins his Gospel with a declaration about Jesus. Why is it significant that Jesus is referred to as the "Son of God" and "the beginning of the gospel"?

7. What was John the Baptist's role, and how did his message prepare the way for Jesus?

8. John speaks about someone coming after him who is mightier. How does this connect to Old Testament prophecies, and what expectations might the people have had?

9. Why did Jesus, being sinless, choose to be baptized by John?

10. How do we see the Trinity represented in this chapter?

11. Jesus begins His ministry with the proclamation, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand." What does this mean, and how does it set the tone for His earthly mission?

12. Jesus calls people to "repent and believe in the gospel." How does this message resonate with John the Baptist's call for repentance, and why is belief emphasized?

13. What is important about Jesus calling His disciples to be "fishers of men"?

14. The people were astonished at Jesus' teaching because He taught with authority. Why would His teaching have carried such authority?

15. Which passage in today's reading impacted you the most? Is there a verse you would like to memorize and/or meditate on today?
