1.	What is the overall context of Leviticus 14? Why were these purification rituals necessary?
2.	In what ways can the role of the priest in Leviticus 14 be seen as a foreshadowing of the role of Jesus Christ in spiritual purification?
3.	How does the process of cleansing in Leviticus 14 point to forgiveness and cleansing in the New Testament through the gospel?
4.	In Psalm 26.1, David declares, "Vindicate me, O Lord, for I have walked in my integrity." What does integrity mean in this context, and how does David express his commitment to it?
5.	According to verses 2-3, David asks God to examine his heart and mind. What is the significance of asking God to test and try his innermost being?
6.	Verse 4 mentions David's decision not to sit with the wicked or associate with hypocrites. Why is this separation important to him, and how does this principle apply to your life?

7.	What does Proverbs 10.6 tell us about God's judgment on good and evil?
8.	What does verse 7 tell us about leaving a godly legacy?
9.	Mark 3.20 says that Jesus' family thought He was out of my mind. Why were they concerned? What was His response in verse 33-35?
10.	Which passage in today's reading impacted you the most? Is there a verse you would like to memorize and/or meditate on today?
