

Bible in a Year Study Questions – Day 57/February 26

Today's Readings:

Leviticus 21 & 22

Psalm 27.10-14

Proverbs 10.13-16

Mark 5.21-43

1. How do the requirements for ritual purity in Leviticus 21 relate to the role of the priests? How do they relate to God's requirements for leaders in the church today? See Titus 1.5-9.
2. What do the prohibitions against those with physical ailments and deformities picture for us as New Testament believers?
3. How does the psalmist express trust in God's faithfulness in contrast to human relationships in Psalm 27.10?
4. How does seeking God's guidance relate to facing challenges and enemies according to verse 11?
5. What did the psalmist mean in verse 13 when he said he believed he would see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living? How does that verse encourage you?
6. Verse 14 encourages us to wait on the Lord. How well do you handle times of waiting? How can you grow your faith and trust in God during those times?

7. How does Proverbs 10.13-16 contrast the actions and results of the wise and the foolish?

8. Verse 15 talks about the rich and the poor. How can both poverty and riches become a snare? On what do both need to depend? How well do you depend on God in your financial situation?

9. What leads Jairus, a ruler of the synagogue, to seek Jesus' help for his daughter in Mark 5.21-24? What does this say about his faith?

10. In verses 25-34 Jesus' journey to Jairus' home was interrupted by a woman. What is significant about her condition and her efforts to seek healing? What does this passage tell us about her faith?

11. How does Jairus respond when he receives the news that his daughter has died in verses 35-37? What is Jesus' response? Is there something in your life about which you need to keep believing?

12. What do verses 41-43 tell us about Jesus' power over death?

13. Which passage in today's reading impacted you the most? Is there a verse you would like to memorize and/or meditate on today?
