Today's Readings:

Leviticus 23 & 24

Psalms 28.1-5

Proverbs 10.17-18

Mark 6.1-29

1. What significance do the various feasts and festivals mentioned in Leviticus 23 hold for the Israelites? How do they point to spiritual truths or foreshadow future events?
2. What instructions are given regarding the observance of the Sabbath in Leviticus 23? How does this commandment emphasize the importance of rest and dedication to God?
3. How do the feasts and festivals remind us about how God wants to dwell with His people and, in fact, how He lives in New Testament believers?
4. Leviticus 24:19-20 introduces the principle of "an eye for an eye." How would you sum up the spirit of this principle?
5. In what ways does the psalmist in Psalm 28.1-5 express his dependence on God for help?
6. How does the concept of God being a secure and unchanging foundation contribute to the psalmist's trust and confidence?

7. In what ways can this psalm provide comfort and guidance in our own moments of distress and uncertainty? How does it speak to you personally?

8. How does a willingness to learn and accept correction contribute to personal growth and wisdom according to Proverbs 10.17-18?

9. How does refusing correction hinder one's personal and spiritual development?

10. Summarize this passage from Proverbs in your own words.

11. Why do the people in Nazareth reject Jesus despite witnessing His wisdom and miracles (Mark 6:1-6)?

12. Examine the instructions Jesus gives to the disciples as He sends them out (Mark 6:7-13).

13. Explore Herod's reaction to the news about Jesus and the rumors regarding John the Baptist (Mark 6:14-16). How might fear and guilt have played a role in Herod's perception of Jesus and John?

14. Which passage in today's reading impacted you the most? Is there a verse you would like to memorize and/or meditate on today?
