

Bible in a Year Study Questions – Day 64 - March 5

Today's Readings:

Numbers 7 & 8

Psalm 31.1-5

Proverbs 11.4-6

Mark 9.1-29

1. What is the main purpose of the offerings brought by the leaders of the tribes in Numbers 7? Why is it significant that each leader brought the same offerings in consecutive days?
2. Why might the leaders' offerings be important?
3. Reflect on the idea of God's glory filling the Tabernacle. How does this relate to the presence of God in our lives?
4. Why were the Levites chosen for a special role in the service of the Tabernacle? How did their preparation for ministry differ from that of the priests?
5. In Psalm 31.5, David entrusts his spirit into God's hands. How does this expression of trust reflect the relationship between the believer and God? How does it relate to Jesus' words on the cross?
6. What did you learn from Proverbs 11.4-6 about the value of pursuing righteousness?

7. Consider the contrast between the "blameless" and the "wicked" in verse 5. What does it mean to be blameless in this context?

8. Explore the idea that the righteousness of the upright delivers them in verse 6. From what are the upright delivered, and how does their righteousness play a role? Contrast this with the wicked being overthrown by their own wickedness. In what ways does wickedness lead to self-destruction?

9. Describe the Transfiguration in Mark 9? Why do you believe Moses and Elijah were the ones present? What was the disciples' response?

10. What was the role of faith in the healing of the boy in Mark 9. What was the father's response to Jesus' question about his faith? How might his response encourage you in your prayers?

11. Which passage in today's reading impacted you the most? Is there a verse you would like to memorize and/or meditate on today?
