

## **Bible in a Year Study Questions – Day 65 - March 6**

### **Today's Readings:**

Numbers 9 & 10

Psalm 31.6-14

Proverbs 11.7-11

Mark 9.30-50

1. Why was it important to have a second opportunity for celebrating the Passover in addition to the regular appointed time in Numbers 9? What does this reveal of God, His character, and His love for His people?
2. Reflect on the significance of the cloud covering the Tabernacle during the day and the appearance of fire by night. How did these serve as visible signs of God's presence?
3. What was the purpose of the silver trumpets in Numbers 10, and how were they used in the Israelite community?
4. How does the psalmist describe God in Psalm 31, particularly in terms of being a refuge and stronghold? How has God shown Himself to be a refuge and stronghold in your life?
5. How does our reading in Proverbs 11.7-11 provide insights into the consequences of righteousness and wickedness?

6. What is the context of the disciples' argument about who is the greatest in Mark 9? Why is this discussion significant? How does Jesus redefine greatness and emphasize humility in His response to the disciples?
  
7. Reflect on the seriousness of Jesus' warnings against causing others to stumble, as expressed in this passage.
  
8. What do the illustrations of cutting off a hand or foot and plucking out an eye convey about the importance of avoiding sin?
  
9. Consider the metaphor of salt in verse 50. What does it symbolize in the context of the disciples' relationships and conduct? How can you be salt to those around you?
  
10. Which passage in today's reading impacted you the most? Is there a verse you would like to memorize and/or meditate on today?
