Bible in a Year Study Questions - Day 66 - March 7

Today's Readings:

Numbers 11 & 12 Psalm 31.15-18 Proverbs 11.12-14 Mark 10.1-31

1.	What were the specific complaints of the people in Numbers 11, and how did God respond to their dissatisfaction?
2.	How do our desires lead us away for our contentment and trust in God? How can they affect our relationships with Him?
3.	How did Moses respond to the people's complaints? What was God's response?
4.	What happened when God provided the abundance of quail and what were the consequences for the people?
5.	How do we see this same principle at work in Romans 1.18-32?
6.	Is there some area where you might be complaining against God's provision in your life? How can you cultivate contentment and thankfulness?

7.	What was the nature of Miriam and Aaron's complaint against Moses in Numbers 12? How might jealousy or resentment have played a role in their attitude towards Moses' leadership?
8.	How did God respond to Miriam and Aaron's criticism of Moses? What was Aaron's response to God's punishment? What did Moses do and what does it say about his character?
9.	Have you experienced jealousy over someone else's leadership? Have you ever faced criticism or questioning of your leadership? How did you respond, and what can you learn from Moses' response?
10.	How does the psalmist's acknowledgement in Psalm 31 of God as the "God of my times" impact your perspective on life's seasons and circumstances?
11.	How can you cultivate a deeper understanding of God's sovereignty in your daily life, especially during challenging times?
12.	What does Proverbs 11.12-14 teach us about the importance of seeking wise counsel? Do you have people in your life from whom you can seek counsel? Do you have friends who can speak into your life on a regular basis?
13.	What question did the Pharisees pose to Jesus in Mark 10, and how did He respond regarding divorce? What does His answer reveal about God's original intention for marriage?

14. What other passages add to our understand of marriage and divorce in the Bible?
15. Describe the encounter between Jesus and the rich young man. What did he ask and how did Jesus respond? How was Jesus speaking the truth in love in his interaction with the young man?
16. Reflect on Jesus' statement about the difficulty for the rich to enter the Kingdom of God. Why is it challenging, and what is the disciples' reaction?
17. Which passage in today's reading impacted you the most? Is there a verse you would like to memorize and/or meditate on today?
