## **Bible in a Year Study Questions – Day 69 - March 10**

## **Today's Readings:**

Numbers 17 & 18 Psalm 32.6-11 Proverbs 11.19-21 Mark 11.20-33

- 1. How do the events in Numbers 17 connect with the rebellion led by Korah in Numbers 16? What is the purpose of gathering staffs from the leaders of each tribe?
- 2. Describe the miraculous event of Aaron's staff budding, blossoming, and bearing almonds. What is the significance of this?
- 3. How do the people react when they witness the miracle of Aaron's staff?
- 4. Explore the connection between the high priesthood in the Old Testament, represented by Aaron, and the role of Jesus as the ultimate High Priest in the New Testament (Hebrews 4:14-16). How does Aaron's priesthood foreshadow the priesthood of Jesus?
- 5. What specific duties and responsibilities are assigned to Aaron and his sons in their role as priests? What are the provisions and offerings allocated to the priests from the people's sacrifices?
- 6. How are the Levites provided for, and what is their role in relation to the priests? What is the significance of the Levites not having an inheritance among the other tribes?

- 7. In verse 20, it mentions that the Lord is the inheritance of the Levites. What does this mean, and how might it apply to our understanding of God's provision for those who serve Him?
- 8. Reflect on the principles of giving, tithing, and providing for those in ministry as outlined in Numbers 18. How can these principles be applied in today's context?
- 9. In what ways does the psalmist encourage others to pray in times of distress, and why is this important (Ps 32.6-11)? How does the psalmist's experience of finding refuge in God relate to your own experiences of seeking God in difficult times?
- 10. How does the psalmist express confidence in God's guidance and instruction? What warning does the psalmist give about being stubborn and resistant to God's guidance?
- 11. How can the principles in Psalm 32:6-11 be applied to your prayer life and your relationship with God?
- 12. What is the reward or outcome for pursuing righteousness according to Proverbs 11.19-21? How can we actively cultivate righteousness in our thoughts, words, and actions, as encouraged by these verses?
- 13. What is the significance of the fig tree withering after Jesus curses it (Mk. 11.20-33)?
- 14. What does Jesus teach about faith and prayer in these verses? How does forgiveness relate to effective prayer?

- 15. Why do the chief priests, scribes, and elders question Jesus' authority? How does Jesus respond to their challenge, and what does His response reveal about His authority?
- 16. In what ways can the principles of faith, prayer, and forgiveness taught by Jesus in these verses be applied in your life?
- 17. Which passage in today's reading impacted you the most? Is there a verse you would like to memorize and/or meditate on today?
