Bible in a Year Study Questions - Day 83 - March 24

Today's Readings:

Deuteronomy 11 & 12 Psalm 37.18-22 Proverbs 12.12 Luke 2.1-24

1.	Reflect on Deuteronomy 11.1-7. What are the Israelites instructed to remember about God's faithfulness in the past? How can remembering strengthen their faith in the present and in the future?
2.	In verses 8-9, what promises are given to the Israelites if they obey God's commands? How do these promises reflect God's desire to bless His people?
3.	Consider verses 18-21. How are the Israelites instructed to teach God's commands to their children? Why is this so important?
4.	Reflect on verses 26-28. What choice does God set before the Israelites? How does obedience lead to blessing, while disobedience leads to cursing?
5.	How do the promises outlined in Deuteronomy 11 give us confidence in trusting God's faithfulness in our own lives? In what area of your life do you need to trust God more?
6.	Reflect on Deuteronomy 12.1-4. Why does God instruct the Israelites to destroy the places where the nations worship their gods? How does idolatry pose a threat to the Israelites' relationship with God, and why is it important to guard against it?

7.	Reflect on verses 7-8. What is the primary purpose of the Israelites' worship according to these verses? How does the emphasis on worshiping God with joy and gratitude apply to our lives as believers today?
8.	Reflect on verses 15-28. How does God remind the Israelites of His provision and care for them in these verses? In what ways can we recognize and give thanks for God's provision in our lives today?
9.	According to Psalm 27.18, what is the ultimate destiny of the righteous? How does verse 19 contrast the fate of the righteous with that of the wicked?
10.	Consider verse 21. What characteristic of the righteous is highlighted in this verse? How does the generosity of the righteous contrast with the actions of the wicked?
11.	How does verse 22 emphasize the temporary nature of the wicked's prosperity and the ultimate judgment they will face?
12.	What is the main message conveyed in Proverbs 12:12?
13.	What historical events are mentioned in Luke 2:1-24, and how do they provide context for the birth of Jesus?
14.	Reflect on the circumstances surrounding the birth of Jesus as described in verses 6-7. What significance do you find in the humble setting of His birth?

15. Consider the shepherds' encounter with the angels in verses 8-14. What message do the angels bring, and why is it significant? How do the shepherds respond to this encounter?
16. Which passage in today's reading impacted you the most? Is there a verse you would like to memorize and/or meditate on today?
